Dear First Parish Members and Friends,

Here we are closing out the church year again! Two Sundays from now we will begin our summer schedule. Here is a reminder of what that looks like:

- June 8: All-ages service and Flower Communion, 10am; Pride Celebration on the Common, 2-4pm; Annual Meeting in the Sanctuary, 4pm.
- June 15: No regular Sunday service.
- June 17: Lay led Juneteenth Celebration (details to be announced).
- June 22: No regular 10am service. We will livestream the General Assembly Sunday Morning Service in the Sanctuary at its special time, 11am ET.
- June 29 – August 31: The Summer Worship Consortium services begin, with the June 29 service at First Parish Bedford.
- September 7: Ingathering!

This summer, we are again having our summer worship consortium program, where five area UU congregations, including First Parish, will take turns offering Sunday services in order to collectively provide a full slate of Sunday services over the summer. Members of all the churches are invited to move around the circuit each Sunday and join in the service wherever it is being hosted.

The five participating churches are First Parish in Bedford, First Parish in Concord, First Parish in Waltham, First Parish in Lincoln, and First Parish in Lexington. The full schedule of services will be posted soon on our website and sent out by email. Bedford will be hosting June 29 (Rev. Annie preaching) and August 10 (I will be preaching). Steve Sussman will be providing piano for our two services.

All services will be at 10am ET. An online option will be available, either by Zoom or livestreamed to YouTube. Childcare will be provided for every service.

Minister's Summer Schedule:

Rev. Annie and I will both be away for General Assembly from June 18 – June 22. I will be away on study leave from July 7 to July 28. Other time away will be announced.

I will save my annual report for a lengthier goodbye to this church year. But suffice to say, it has been a remarkable year, and you are a remarkable community. Have a wonderful summer, and I look forward to next year!

Minister's Musings

When I returned from sabbatical, many things were comfortingly the same. Worship, community hour, youth groups, so many same faces and rhythms welcoming me back. But one thing that was noticeably different was the code I needed to use to get into the building. Yes, we have a new security system.

I am not generally the most security minded person. I tend to be trusting and not-very-fearful which has pros and cons. But in this moment we are living in, I am recognizing the need for more technical tools for security. Yes, even as I curse repeatedly over my inability to effectively use Cryptpad while crying out my sad love for the totally not secure tech mega giant Google. Even as the absurd number of notifications in Signal rises. (For any who don't know, Cryptpad is an encrypted document sharing platform, aka Google Docs for people trying to be security minded and Signal is an encrypted messaging app. But I'm sure everyone knows that one thanks to that journalist from the Atlantic.)

I've come to appreciate technical tools like Cryptpad or keypads with unique entry codes on doors even though they are annoying and inconvenient. They are helpful forms of protection to mitigate risk. And I also appreciate that we as a community continue to choose courage and connection. I'd much rather struggle through Cryptpad and keep working on outreach to people whose loved ones are detained. I'd much rather put a keypad on the door and keep making our pro-immigrant, pro-LGBTQ, pro-democracy politics known publicly.

This is a wild time. And we need one another more than ever. We need to balance safety and integrity, caution and boldness. I think we are doing a good job. I hope we all stay connected this summer, stay brave, stay clear and stay as safe as we can.



Office Matters

***REMINDER: Security System**.....all three phases of the security system have now been installed. Unfortunately, we are experiencing some quirks as we finish the first full month, with the alarm panel being armed during the day on Memorial Day weekend, the entry system periodically failing, etc... ADT technicians will be on site this week to hopefully rectify these issues. Please bear with us as we muddle through these early stages.

***REMINDER: New Pledge Year/Payments**.....although our official Stewardship campaign has ended, as you start sending in payments for your new pledge, **PLEASE** make sure to write the appropriate campaign year on the memo line of your check (i.e. Pledge Year 24/25 or Pledge Year 25/26). Also, if you are making an online payment, please make sure to select the appropriate year from the drop-down menus in One Church. These steps will help us accurately credit your current and future pledge. If you have any questions, please email or call me at the office.

***Reimbursement Requests.....**there are green reimbursement forms in the office, so if you would like to grab a couple the next time you are in the building, please feel free. Hold on to your receipts and submit them (along with the reimbursement form) to the appropriate Committee Chairperson for approval/signature. **Also, it's very important to check with the Chairperson on which line item in the budget should be debited.** Once it's complete, please submit everything to me in the office or leave them in my mailbox out back. Also please remember to include the address where you wish to have the check mailed. Typically, I work on accounts payable every Thursday morning and checks go out in Friday's mail.

***Booking Rooms/Zooms.....**in an effort to accommodate everyone fairly, I ask that all requests for rooms/Zoom meetings be made in advance by at least 3-5 business days. We understand last minute requests will occasionally happen, but if everyone tries to work within these parameters, we will be more successful in meeting your needs.

***Hybrid Meetings/Technology.....**If you're having a hybrid meeting, please reach out to the office and request our OWL camera or our new speakerphone. The camera, phone and all the accessories can be found in the locked cabinet under the mailboxes. Also, we now have ethernet cables (and two types of adapters available) in the following rooms: Common Room, 204 and 203. To book the Owl camera, the speakerphone or request to use one of the adapters, please contact Stacey at the office.

***IMPORTANT REMINDER: Leftover Food Policy.....**with all of the food events coming up, this is a reminder about our leftover food policy we put in place with regards to Memorial Services, receptions, parties, etc.... This policy was created in conjunction with the members of the Hospitality Team to address safety concerns (i.e. food allergies) and food waste concerns. Below please find the details:

- Leftover perishable foods can only be served to children/youth the same day;
- Common allergen food labels in bowl/basket to be put out with foods being served to reduce accidental consumption;
- Provide communication to internal/external groups that **all food must be removed after the event,** with the exception of packaged food or one medium tray per item (i.e. one vegetable tray, one fruit tray, etc...);
- Tape/marker will be left in the kitchen for easy labeling of dates on food;
- Ice cream related toppings need to be checked for expiration dates so they don't pile up.

***Email Lists.....**please find below an explanation of **our three email lists** for use by the First Parish community. For anyone who would like to join one (or more) of the three email lists, please contact me so I can verify whether or not you're already signed up. If you're not, I can add you with your preferred email address. (Note: sometimes these messages might end up in your Spam/Junk folders, so please double-check those folders). As always, we ask that you be mindful of each of their uses, and please remember to be kind and respectful with your communications.

- Parish Business (ParishBiz) List – communicates important news and events from FP staff and leadership to the parish. **We encourage all Parishioners to subscribe to ParishBiz.**
- Announcement (Anno) List – used to *facilitate* announcements of news and events of general interest to the community (i.e. Does anyone know a good chiropractor?).
- Discussion (Disc) List – a means of promoting (*or responding to*) the discussion of issues of general interest to the community.

Update on First Friday Potluck Suppers

Potluck suppers on the first Friday of every month have been a cherished tradition at First Parish going back many years providing a time to share delicious food and wonderful company.

For the last several years, Ron Green has been our stalwart leader in organizing these events and we would like to extend our heartfelt thanks to him for his dedication and leadership. He has ensured that everything runs smoothly, from sending out reminders each month to setting up the Common Room, turning the ovens on, purchasing wine, and overseeing cleanup. After many years at the helm, now it is time for him to take a well-deserved break and simply enjoy attending!

Going forward, we would like to rotate this responsibility so it does not fall on just one person/couple. Currently, three couples (Carla & Paul Bradford, Sandy & Mike Boczenowski, and Marge & Norm Heckman) have agreed to rotate coordination of the potluck each month. Greetings from your SRC! The final recipient of this year's Share the Plate program carries forward a message of hope for the future. Come to the service on Sunday, June 1, to learn about [Sowing Opportunities](#), an organization that works collaboratively with indigenous communities in rural Guatemala to cultivate self-sustainability, education, and wellness and to help them remain safe and food secure. You can donate to support their good work via cash/check or [online at OneChurch](#).

Sometimes volunteer work can seem like . . . well, work. We schedule meetings, create goals, craft agendas, plan and implement projects, and activate Zoom links. Sometimes we can get bogged down just trying to find the time to meet.

But then . . . oh then! We gather. We laugh. We commiserate. We support. As SRC members, we hear from [amazing people doing amazing things in Community](#), who remind us that the needles we are helping to move do not change things overnight. Rather, change happens in the repeated, consistent, and reliable actions of well-meaning people.

Our SRC motto this year came from a marathon meeting where many of us arrived feeling emotionally and physically exhausted between busy schedules, seasonal illnesses, and an overwhelming news cycle. After hearing from six groups doing work in our communities, as the last visitor left the room and several of us wiped away tears, Elise announced, "Best. Day. Ever!"

We now regularly call back to that phrase — that feeling of gathering, being present, pushing back the darkness, and supporting work that has an impact. And we invite you to join in that feeling during the next church year by attending an SRC meeting and [proposing](#) causes to support.

Capital Campaign Definition Task Force Update

During the 2025-26 church year, our task force evaluated the physical needs of FPB's historic building and parsonage over the coming decade. We sought input from multiple FPB stakeholders including the physical plant, finance, music and environmental justice committees, staff, the Parish Board and the entire congregation. We also considered FPB's values and commitments with regards to sustainability and accessibility. Given our goals of moving away from fossil fuels, some of this proposed work may require upgrades to our electric service. Based upon feedback received, we recommend prioritizing major FPB infrastructure work as follows:

High priority:

- Replacement of end-of-life HVAC rooftop system serving the rear addition:
 - ❖ In-kind replacement of three units, least green, estimate \$120K
 - ❖ Replace all four units with dual fuel units, more efficient, estimate \$208K
 - ❖ VRF air source heat pump system with improved zoning within building, even more efficient, estimate TBD
 - ❖ Geothermal heat pumps, very efficient, estimate \$750K
- Backup power: Information gathering in process. Options include batteries, and emergency generator
- Organ repair: Estimate \$56K
- Replace gas range in main kitchen: Estimate \$10K - \$20K. Options include:
 - ❖ Replace in kind with new gas range, least green
 - ❖ Induction range, electric powered, more green
 - ❖ Induction cooktop with new counter below, more green
- Continued improvements to the fire suppression system: Estimate \$140K

Medium priority:

- Common Room rear ramp for ADA accessibility: Estimate \$75K
- Parsonage bathroom renovation for improved accessibility: Estimate \$75K

Low priority:

- Additional solar panels
- Power co-generation
- Digital wayside pulpit
- Improved acoustics
- Parsonage window replacement

Items in this last category are deprioritized based on their compatibility with current systems, genuine need assessment, project permission likelihood and/or urgency.

Previous campaigns greatly benefited from guidance from outside consultant guidance. So this February, we requested a quote for situation analysis, feasibility study and capital campaign support from a UUA Stewardship Consultant. The consultant proposed performing 3 phases of work from planning through the completed capital campaign. The total cost would come to approximately \$20K if all the proposed consulting work is approved.

There is significant uncertainty in the US economy at this time. Capital campaign planning should take economic conditions into account. Assuming the economy does not suffer major setbacks over the coming year, our task force recommends the following campaign schedule:

- Jun-Aug 2025: Continue gathering cost information for highest-priority candidate projects and develops a tiered budget incorporating contingencies
- Sep 2025: Stewardship consultant performs initial analysis over one weekend
- Sep/Oct 2025: Parish board appoints Capital Campaign committee
- Nov 2025 Semi-annual meeting: Announce feasibility study led by UU consultant
- Nov/Dec 2025: Consultant performs feasibility study
- Jan 2026: Special congregational meeting to vote on undertaking Capital Campaign
- Apr 2026: Capital Campaign runs in conjunction with Stewardship Campaign
- 2026-2029: FPB receives pledged campaign funds from congregation

This task force will continue to develop technical information and cost estimates until the successor Capital Campaign committee is formed.

The purpose of the Parish Council is to promote communication and coordination across the church committees, Leadership Team, and Parish Board regarding church programs, scheduling, and the development of the annual operating plan and budget.

The Parish Council met three times this year. All of the committees were asked to update their charters consisting of the committee's purpose, roles, and responsibilities. This was a significant endeavor which we believe improved transparency in the work of the church.

Additionally, each meeting included discussions on how to share information across all committees. "Best Practices" and 'Publicity How-To' documents are now available to all committee members. New member recruitment was a hot topic with many members highlighting that sharing the benefits of participation is key to increasing volunteer engagement. At the upcoming Sunday after-service FPB Committee Fair-make your own Sundae event (June 1st), we plan to have volunteers share information about their committees. Interested? WHAT DOES DEMOCRACY LOOK LIKE?

THIS IS WHAT DEMOCRACY LOOKS LIKE!

The First Parish Gallery Committee would like to open the next church year by sponsoring a show about Democracy, an idea suggested to us by Karen Frederick. What does Democracy look like to you and your family and friends? We are calling for art on this theme...from protest signs, photos of protests (maybe photos of the Friday afternoon protests), or things that you value and want to protect and nurture in our democracy. 
Stewardship

Stewardship - Congratulations to all who've made our campaign successful!

To support our FY25-26 budget, the Parish Board requested a Stewardship Campaign goal to raise \$584,000 from 206 pledging families. The campaign began on March 16th and officially ended five weeks ago on April 20th, Easter Sunday. Since then, we've been reaching out to those who had not pledged and thereby received additional pledges of \$53,370. As of today, the congregation has pledged a total of \$552,604, which represents 95% of the \$584,000 pledge goal. Those pledges come from 194 households, a participation rate of 94%. We are also 'cautiously optimistic' that some other pledges will still come in.

A few stats: Last year's pledges totaled \$544,891 from 193 households. This year's total of \$552,604 reflects an additional \$8,213 in pledges. This year's average and median pledges are currently \$2,848 and \$1,950, respectively. The corresponding values from last year were \$2,818 and \$1,800.

This year's campaign theme "A Beacon of Light" likened our church to a lighthouse – a signal of safety and hope in troubling times. That this has been a turbulent year is undeniable but with your generous support, that light continues to burn bright!

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby authorized and instructed to notify the voters of said First Parish in Bedford in the County of Middlesex to meet in person or remotely via Zoom on Sunday, the eighth day of June 2025, at four o'clock in the afternoon and then and there to act on the following articles, viz:

- I. To elect a Clerk and Moderator to serve from now until at the June 2026 meeting. Nominees are **Rebecca Green Neale**, Clerk; and **Robert Dorer**, Moderator.
- II. To appoint a Minutes Committee. This group of three people will be responsible for reviewing the Clerks' minutes of today's meeting in a timely manner, prior to being presented for a vote by the parish.
- III. To hear and act on the minutes of the Parish Meeting held on November 10, 2024.
- IV. To hear the reports of the Senior Minister, Parish Board President, Minister of Faith Development, Director of Faith Development for Children, and Treasurer.
- V. To elect two members-at-large to the Parish Board. Nominees are **Robert "Ted" Carlson** (term ending 2028) and **Mark Bailey** (term ending 2028).
- VI. To elect two members to the Social Responsibility Council. Nominees are **Moriah Tumbleson-Shaw** (term ending 2028) and **Heather Black** (term ending 2028).
- VII. To elect one member to the Nominating Committee. Nominee is **Jennifer McClain** (term ending 2028).
- VIII. To adopt an Operating Budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025 thru June 30, 2026.
- IX. To authorize the Parish Board to approve funding for programs and services based on additional pledges received during the first six months of the fiscal year.
- X. To approve revisions of the By-laws of First Parish in Bedford Unitarian Universalist as follows:
 - Article III (Membership) item C: on last line change the word "Destructive" to "*Disruptive*"
 - Article VI (Governance of the Parish) item C: Standing Committees; *item 1 and item 2 (a-i)*; [see handout with revised wording and additions]

- Article VII (The Nominating Committee) item C; reword the last sentence to read "No member may serve more than one *consecutive* three-year term, fractional terms being disregarded."
- Article VIII (The Social Responsibility Council) item B: add "..., *another to serve as treasurer, and another to serve as communications officer*" at the end of the second to last sentence.
