Title: "We Shall Not Be Moved" (Led by Rev. Jamie)
A classic protest song says, "We shall not be moved." What is it that we shall not be moved from? What are the elements of Unitarian Universalism that are anchoring us in this moment in history?

Sunday, November 9th
Title: "One Last Sermon" (Led by Rev. Bill Schulz)
Bill Schulz was ordained and installed as minister of First Parish on the evening of November 9, 1975, exactly fifty years ago this day. He went on to become President of the UUA (1985-93); Executive Director of Amnesty International USA (1994-2006); and President of the UU Service Committee (2010-16), during the latter of which he served as an Affiliate Community Minister at FPB and preached once a year. Bill returns this Sunday to reflect on whether he's learned anything important over these last fifty years.

Sunday, November 16th
Title: "Try Everything" (Led by Rev. Annie)
How do you hopefully persist when situations are daunting or nobody seems to know what to do? We'll explore the strengths and limitations of trying many different approaches and how we can be thoughtful and resilient together.

Sunday, November 23rd
Title: "Wonderful World" (Led by the Worship Team)
This all-ages service will feature the Youth Choirs, a story by Nate, and a reflection by Rev. Jamie. In this season of thanksgiving, we celebrate the beauty and fullness of the world and our natural response to care for her and the interdependent web of life. Join us for a service of gratitude and celebration.

Sunday, November 30th
Title: "On Heritage Americans" (Led by Rev. Jamie)
Recently there has been an attempt by some in the culture and in the current administration to redefine what it means to be American, and crucially, who counts as American. At a time when our Indigenous neighbors are observing the National Day of Mourning, let's take a critical look at this new language of "Heritage Americans" and what it portends for our collective future.

A Note from Jamie

Dear First Parish Members and Friends,

What a joy it was to see the debut of the Youth Choirs this past Sunday! Welcome back, Janet Welby! And if you did not have a chance to join us up in the gallery for the art reception after the service, make sure you check out the show, "What Does Democracy Look Like (to you)?" It is powerful and inspiring. Kudos as well to the Music Committee for bringing us the music of Ravel. Maybe you attended that concert fresh from the No Kings Rally organized by the Public Witness Team, which drew 800 people to Veterans Memorial Park in defense of democracy. First Parish is such a vibrant community, and we are finding so many meaningful ways to live into our values and to share that with the larger community. I hope you are feeling that!

Speaking of living into our values: the Capital Campaign is coming! The closer it gets and the more it unfolds (thanks to the remarkable work of the Capital Campaign Task Force!) the more exciting it gets. Last week we had the consultants from GreenerU tour our facility. They are experts in helping congregations go green. With this campaign we have a historic opportunity to do just that as we look at transforming our legacy HVAC systems. But the transformation we are envisioning is bigger than that. We are looking at a plan that will also make us more accessible, with a ramp from the Common exit. The plan will encourage more community, with a modernized range in the kitchen. I have heard so many of you talk about your memories of the multigenerational meals at Ferry Beach and how community building that was. We are planning for more and more events and programs like that, and the kitchen upgrade is a piece of that vision. The proposed soundproofing of 201 will improve our ability to house people in the building for years to come, living into that part of our values and vision. And there is a plan to give our youth some funding of their own with which to develop their own ideas, so they have a stake in our future too and a chance to shape what it looks like.

You will hear more about the capital campaign at the semi-annual meeting on November 9th. Please plan to attend. In the meantime, it has been exciting to hear all the ideas about the future of First Parish that just the process of envisioning the capital campaign has been stirring up. This is a time for reflection on what we love about this community, what its core values are, and what we want for its future. Please keep having that conversation and sharing your ideas with each other and with church leadership. My door is always open and I would love to hear what you're thinking. I know the Board would love to hear from you too.

This is an exciting time for First Parish. Thank you for all you are creating together. It is, as always, a privilege to be a part of it.

I would like to encourage you to add one more thing to your “must read” pile—**the monthly Parish Board meeting minutes**. These minutes not only capture the business of that particular evening, they also include the ministerial monthly reports which never fail to awe me. Our clergy and faith development teams are a dedicated and busy crew. Here are [September’s approved minutes](#). I will provide a link to the most recently approved minutes in my monthly column.

Have you heard there is a Capital Campaign coming? I hope so. We’ve been spreading the message by word of month, in the order of service, on the list-servs, and even in this newsletter (yet another good reason to put this email in your “must read” pile). I encourage you to read up, ask your fellow parishioners, and begin to think about what you can give to the future of this building and its community.

As mentioned last month, the Parish Board had its annual retreat in September. At our October meeting we refined **our goals for the 2025-2026 program year**. I will be sharing these at our semi-annual meeting on Sunday, November 9 with more explanation. Here they are in their brief format.

1. Strengthen and grow church membership by creating, promoting, and supporting acts of invitation and inclusion.
2. Encourage church members and committees to seek out and utilize existing social justice resources.
3. Equip existing committee leadership with resources and skills that promote individual and group enrichment, in order to enhance communication between the Parish Council and the Board, and ultimately with the congregation at large.
4. Champion the capital campaign.
5. Support other existing spiritual, community, financial, and facilities work.

As always, please feel free to reach out to any of the Board members with any questions or comments.

***REMINDER: New Pledge Year/Payments**.....our 2025/2026 Stewardship campaign is well underway. As you send in payments for your pledge, **PLEASE** make sure to write the appropriate campaign year on the memo line of your check (i.e. Pledge Year 24/25 or Pledge Year 25/26). **Also, if you are making an online payment, please make sure to select the appropriate designation from the drop-down menus in Breeze.** These steps will help us accurately credit your pledge and donations. If you have any questions, please email or call me at the office.

***Reimbursement Requests**.....there are green reimbursement forms in the office, so if you would like to grab a couple the next time you are in the building, please feel free. Hold on to your receipts and submit them (along with the reimbursement form) to the appropriate Committee Chairperson for approval/signature. **Also, it’s very important to check with the Chairperson on which line item in the budget should be debited.** Once it’s complete, please submit everything to me in the office or leave them in my mailbox out back. Also please remember to include the address

where you wish to have the check mailed. Typically, I work on accounts payable every Wednesday morning and checks go out in Friday's mail.

***Booking Rooms/Zooms.....**in an effort to accommodate everyone fairly, I ask that all requests for rooms/Zoom meetings be made in advance by at least 3-5 business days. We understand last minute requests will occasionally happen, but if everyone tries to work within these parameters, we will be more successful in meeting your needs.

***Hybrid Meetings/Technology.....**If you're having a hybrid meeting, please reach out to the office and request our OWL camera or speakerphone. The camera, phone and all the accessories can be found in the locked cabinet under the mailboxes. Also, we now have ethernet cables (and two types of adapters available) in the following rooms: Common Room, 204 and 203. To book the Owl camera, the speakerphone or request to use one of the adapters, please contact Marika at the office.

***IMPORTANT REMINDER: Leftover Food Policy.....**with all of the food events coming up, this is a reminder about our leftover food policy we put in place with regards to Memorial Services, receptions, parties, etc.... This policy was created in conjunction with the members of the Hospitality Team to address safety concerns (i.e. food allergies) and food waste concerns. Below please find the details:

- Leftover perishable foods can only be served to children/youth the same day;
- Common allergen food labels in bowl/basket to be put out with foods being served to reduce accidental consumption;
- Provide communication to internal/external groups that **all food must be removed after the event**, with the exception of packaged food or one medium tray per item (i.e. one vegetable tray, one fruit tray, etc...);
- Tape/marker will be left in the kitchen for easy labeling of dates on food;
- Ice cream related toppings need to be checked for expiration dates so they don't pile up.

***Email Lists.....**please find below an explanation of **our three email lists** for use by the First Parish community. For anyone who would like to join one (or more) of the three email lists, please contact me so I can verify whether or not you're already signed up. If you're not, I can add you with your preferred email address. (Note: sometimes these messages might end up in your Spam/Junk folders, so please double-check those folders). As always, we ask that you be mindful of each of their uses, and please remember to be kind and respectful with your communications.

- Parish Business (ParishBiz) List – communicates important news and events from FP staff and leadership to the parish. **We encourage all Parishioners to subscribe to ParishBiz.**
- Announcement (Anno) List – used to *facilitate* announcements of news and events of general interest to the community (i.e. Does anyone know a good chiropractor?).
- Discussion (Disc) List – a means of promoting (*or responding to*) the discussion of issues of general interest to the community.

Upcoming End-of-Life Planning Programs

Our dominant cultural orientation toward matters of death and dying is avoidance. Hopefully, at First Parish in Bedford, we can help each other be more at ease talking about issues relating to death – our own and of those we love – and also preparing for our dying and death. This is hard, but oh so important work that can truly be a gift to ourselves and our loved ones.

Starting in January and into the spring, Maureen Richichi, FPB's End of Life Doula, will again offer sessions (in person and on Zoom) for parishioners interested in exploring such topics as:

- Considering one's needs and wishes for end-of-life care and informing family and loved ones.
- Advance Planning for end-of-life: Health Care Proxy; Health Care Advance Directive; POLSTS; DNR.
- End-of-life care options: Palliative, Hospice and Death Doula care, as well as alternative options such as not starting/stopping medical treatment; Medical Aid in Dying; Voluntary Stopping of Eating and Drinking.
- Body Care and Disposition options.
- Necessary tasks when a loved one dies.
- Talking about death and dying with children.
